Day-of Entries

Day-of entries will be allowed for \$17.00 per regular run and \$36.00 for Masters Series and must be received by 7:30am Saturday/Sunday.

MyDogEntry

We highly recommend that if you haven't already, you create/log into your account on [MyDogEntry](#) even if you didn't use MDE to enter the trial. You can check your dogs in very easily using MDE, download the maps from there on each day of the trial, and follow along with the running order in real time. No app required! Instructions on creating an account were in your confirmation email.

Trial Site Rules & Information

Set up will be only allowed on Saturday morning once the trial opens at 7am. If you would like to come Friday evening to help unload the equipment trailer and set-up the rings at 6pm, you can set up after that. Please bring your own crate, clean up supplies, and water for your dog. Ex-pens and canopies are permitted. Crates, gear, etc., may be left overnight; however, we will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the trial site. Dogs must be on leash at all times, except when in the ring. Please exercise and potty dogs only in designated areas. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Please be courteous to others using the area, keeping in mind this is a public park. No aggressive dogs allowed on show grounds. A warm-up jump will be provided for all exhibitors.

Directions to the Trial

From I-70 take exit 265 for CO-58 W towards Golden. Take exit for McIntyre St. Turn left on 54th Ave. Turn left onto Quaker St.

Parking

Sorry, no RV parking is allowed except for trial security.

Course maps will be released when doors open at 7am and will be available for download on [MyDogEntry](#). Paper copies will be posted at the trial site.

UKI TRIAL INFORMATION YOU MAY FIND HELPFUL

Measuring

Please ensure you understand the new criteria regarding dogs being measured. (See [UKI Rule Book edition 11](#) pg. 27). All newly registered dogs, or dogs without a permanent measure, or not jumping full height (24", 22", 20" select), must be measured by a UKI judge or approved UKI measurer to determine the dog's jump height. A dog's first measurement must be obtained and sent to the UKI office by the dog's third trial. A measurement from another organization may be used for this first measure if it is an actual measurement and is not within .25" (6mm) of a jump height cut off. A dog's next measure must be obtained between 12 months and by a maximum of 18 months after the dog's first recorded measurement. If this timeframe is not met, the dog is unable to compete at any UKI event until this is done. This measure will be the dog's permanent measure. If a newly registered dog is aged three years and older, the dog will only need one measurement, and this must be by a UKI measurer. No other organization's measure may be used for this. If a dog is found to have achieved results when it has not complied with the measurement rules, all results that have been gained while breaking these rules will be void and any progression will be rescinded.

Course Walk-Throughs

It is the competitor's responsibility to be aware of what is happening in the rings and be ready for your course walk-throughs. All jump heights will walk at the same time. For example, when the Beginner/Novice Speedstakes course is up for walking – all heights, including the Select options will walk.

Gate Sheets

Instead of gate sheets, we will be checking in and keeping track of the running order on a tablet located at the ring with the gate steward. You can also check yourself in by using your phone, tablet or laptop and going to [MyDogEntry](#) the morning of the trial. Please check in for your class by ticking your dog's name.

Running

It is the competitor's responsibility to know what is going on in the rings. When your jump height is running in your class, you must be ready to run. There will be a real-time running order you can follow on [MyDogEntry](#).

Moving Up

- Beginners to Novice – Equivalent of 3 clear rounds (12 points, 8 from agility)
- Novice to Senior – Equivalent of 5 clear rounds (20 points, 12 from agility, 4 from jumping, 4 from games)
- Senior to Champ – Equivalent of 9 clear rounds (36 points, 12 from agility, 12 from jumping, 12 from games)

UKI does next day move ups!

If you gain enough points at a trial, you must move up to the next level on the next day or trial. If it is the second day of a trial, please see the trial secretary to fill out a move up form.

Training Rounds – Not for Competition (NFC)

You may opt to make any run you have signed up for a "NFC" training Round for which you may bring in a non-audible toy into the ring. You may not use clickers! You must state NFC prior to entering the ring. The Scribe will write NFC across your scribe ticket and notify the judge. You will be given the course time to do what you wish. Listen for the buzzer when your time is up – you must immediately exit the ring.

If you do not notify the judge and scribe ahead of time that you are doing NFC, you will not be able to turn your run into a training run if you are faulted on course. Repeating any piece of equipment will be deemed training and the judge will ask you to leave the ring immediately if you do this.

Conflicts

There should be very few conflicts at this trial. If you are running multiple dogs, and have fewer than nine dogs between each dog, you will be given six minutes from the end of a run with one to retrieve the other. You must let the gate steward know who will then put a "C" next to your name in [MyDogEntry](#).

Results

It is important that you check your scored result to be sure you agree with it. If you think there is a problem, you will need to speak to the judge before he or she forgets your run. The judge's decision is final, so if you wait and the judge cannot remember your run, the scribe sheet will stand. Please remember that if the judge disagrees with you once you have stated your case, you must be a good sport and remember that the judge is only human, and judging is still subjective. You will win some and you will lose some, but again the judge's decision is final. You can check your scribed run directly at the scoring table during your class.

Once all the heights within a class are finished, the results will be submitted to the show secretary by either downloading from computer scoring, or handwritten results sheets, for sorting of level points and reading out for prizes. The results will then be available for viewing by all competitors.

NFC Treat Station/Reward Box

Competitors running NFC may use the Treat Station/Reward Box to provide food rewards for their dog. Food rewards will be allowed in the Treat Station/Reward Box only for NFC runs (except for Masters Series). The Treat Station/Reward Box will have a gate that is closed when not in use and the food must be placed on a table or raised platform.

Mulligan Runs

Mulligans will be allowed for all runs except for Masters Series. Cost will be \$5 per run and only competitors entered in the class are eligible. Competitors must sign up and pay for their Mulligan run prior to or immediately following their regular run and before the completion of the class. Toys are allowed, as are treats in the Treat Station, the same as for NFC runs.

Bitches in Season

BIS may run at this trial at the end of their class and must start on a mat the club will provide.

Food

No food vender will be present, but there are food options nearby. We recommend you bring your lunch and snacks.
